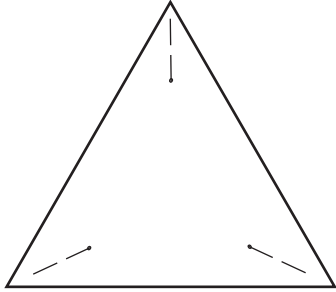
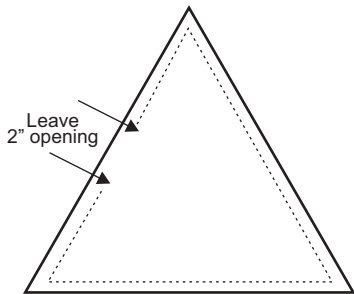


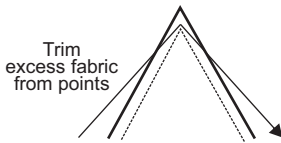
# Triangular Thread Catcher



- 1 Pin together two contrasting pieces of fabric face to face and cut a perfect triangle (with 60° angles). A typical size might be 10 1/2" on a side. A tiny version is around 9" per side.



- 2 Stitch around the edge with a 1/4" seam leaving a 2" opening in the center of one side.



- 3 Carefully trim excess fabric from each point. Using a chopstick or similar tool turn inside out and press. The opening does not need to be stitched closed as it will be caught in the stitching of the sides.



- 4 Fold one of the three sides in half. The side showing will be the outside of your thread catcher. Measure the half way point of that folded edge and mark a point about 1/4" below that. Topstitch close to the edge from the fold to the marked point making sure to secure the ends with some additional sewing. Sew the other two sides the same length. Sewing less than half way allows for a larger opening.



- 5 Fold down your points almost to the flat bottom and secure with a button or some decorative stitching.
