

## Block Party for February

After challenging you with our applique bird in January we are going to do a simple flying geese block. We'll call this Snow Geese because the look should reflect the colors of sky blue geese and pure white snow. It's a small (4" x 2") block). So we hope you will make two or three or four! Instructions below are for a single block done with the stitch and flip method.

But we are offering an unusual option. There is a simple, no waste method for making four geese at one time. If you want to give it a try go to <http://www.patchpieces.com/files/flyinggeese.pdf> and cut the blue fabric 5 1/4" square and the white squares 2 7/8" square. Have fun!

### Materials Needed

Sky blue print: One rectangle 4 1/2" x 2 1/2"

White (plain): Two 2 1/2" squares

### Instructions

Draw diagonal lines on both of the white squares. With the blue print face up align one of the white squares at one end. Sew on the diagonal line. Press up to make sure it lines up with the edges before you trim away underneath. Now sew on the second square using the same method to form your "geese" triangle.

To participate, make the block described, bring it to the meeting, post your block(s) on the design board, and place your name (one for each block you bring) into the pot. The winner of the drawing will take home all the blocks.
