The traditional disappearing 4-patch block has many variations. This September block uses only 2 fabrics: a sunflower print and a yellow solid or blender. If you don't have any sunflower fabric, use a fall-colored floral or abstract print.

Cutting;
A. Sunflower fabric: Cut two 5 -inch squares
B. Yellow fabric: Cut two 5 -inch squares

Sewing: (.25-inch seams)

1. Arrange the pieces to make a 4 -patch as shown in Figure 1 below.
2. Sew the four squares together. Press to the dark fabric.

3. Lay the center horizontal seam on a line on a cutting mat. Position the 1-inch line of a long ruler on the seam and cut a 1 -inch horizontal strip. Repeat on the other side of the seam.
4. Now position the 1 -inch line of your ruler on the vertical seam and cut a 1-inch strip on each side of the seam. You now have 9 patches.
5. Reverse each rectangular piece in place to look like Figure 2 below.
6. Sew the 9 patches together, carefully matching seams.
7. Press horizontal seams to the center. Press vertical seams towards the outside of the block.
8. Press block, keeping seam lines straight.

Finished block should measure 8.5 -inches square. Do not trim; let the quilt maker do this.

To participate in the September Block Party, make the block as described; mail or drop off to Karel Peer. Your name will be entered once for each block received (enclose a note if you don't want your name in the drawing). Blocks must be received by Saturday, September 23rd. The winner will be drawn during the September 25th online meeting and will be in the October newsletter.
